Siddharth Varadarajan is a Founding Editor of *The Wire.com* and he has studied at the London School of Economics and Columbia University. He was earlier the Editor of The Hindu and is a recipient of the Ramnath Goenka Award for Journalism of the Year. He has taught Economics at New York University and Journalism at the University of California, Berkeley and is Poynter Fellow at the Yale University, besides working at the Times of India and the Centre for Public Affairs and Critical Theory, Shiv Nadar University. Some of the events on which he had reported about; the NATO War against Yugoslavia, Crisis in Kashmir, War in Iraq and the destruction of the Bamyán Buddhas in Afghanistan. Mr. Varadarajan has received in November 2005 the Elizabeth Neuffer Memorial Prize Silver Medal for Print Journalism for a series of articles and in March 2006. He received the Bernardo O'Higgins Order by the President of Chile. Mr. Varadarajan edited the book *The Making of a Tragedy*, published by Penguin India.
