About the talk: The talk would focus on the U.S. - India trade relationship bilaterally and at the World Trade Organization (WTO). The speaker would talk about how the United States and India worked cooperatively to achieve the Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) in the WTO.

About the Speaker: Dawn Shackelford is the Deputy Assistant U.S. Trade Representative for India in the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative (USTR). She is the lead U.S. negotiator on bilateral trade issues with India and is responsible for managing the U.S. - India Trade Policy Forum. Dawn previously served as the Deputy Assistant U.S. Trade Representative for WTO and Multilateral Affairs and was the lead U.S. negotiator for the new WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement where she regularly engaged with the Indian delegation. Dawn also served as the lead negotiator on the customs and trade facilitation chapter of the Trans-Atlantic Trade and Investment Partnership Agreement, WTO accession negotiations and was a senior advisor on issues pertaining to the WTO and its standing committees. She was the U.S. Representative to the OECD Trade Committee and a lead advisor on trade issues concerning the UN and other international organizations. Dawn joined USTR in 2004 as a lead negotiator in the U.S. FTA negotiations with Oman and the United Arab Emirates, and worked on various WTO, APEC, G20, UN and NAFTA trade policy issues.
